A NEW new outdoor music festival organised by Love Music Hate Violence (LMHV) and Slough Bid is set to take place this weekend.

Slough Fest is the first of its kind, aimed at bringing the Slough community together and promoting local talent and businesses.

Starting at 11:30AM and running until 5:30PM on Saturday, October 15,the fest will take place at Town Square, outside Empire Cinema on Slough High Street.

Organiser Stephen Ambrose, also known as DJ and music producer Stevoss, says the event is aimed at "supporting local artists by giving them a platform".



Environment

One of the most effective, and long-term ways to mitigate against the energy price rises is to reduce energy consumed, through efficiency upgrades.

Such improvements include; LED lighting, solar PV, heating system upgrades, and insulation/glazing to improve heat retention. The main barrier to these may well be the initial cost. However, a Low Carbon Workspaces' grant from £1,000 - £5,000 can help fund a third of the cost of such projects at commercial premises.

Grants cannot be paid retrospectively so it is essential to apply before undertaking work or appointing suppliers. Uber Launches Funds for Blackowned Restaurant Businesses

Black-owned restaurants across the UK are set to receive a cash boost as Uber Eats significantly expands its Black Business Fund in 2022.

In collaboration with Enterprise Nation and Be Inclusive Hospitality, the Uber Eats Black Business Fund will award a total of £250,000 to twenty-five small Black-owned businesses. At least half of the grants will go to small businesses outside of London.

Black-owned restaurants with fewer than five locations can now apply to the Uber Eats Black Business Fund with applications opening on October 14th and closing on November 25th. As well as funding to help grow their businesses, restaurants will receive special mentoring from Enterprise Nation. For more
